Subject: Regarding Members inputs on Brazil's Trade Remedial Framework & Practices (Procedural/Substantive) for India-Brazil Trade Monitoring Mechanism (TMM) Meeting

With reference to the below circular, the 7th meeting of the India–Brazil Trade Monitoring Mechanism (TMM) is scheduled to be held on 7th October, 2025 in New Delhi. One of the agenda items under “**Market Access Issues and Trade Barriers**” relates to **Anti-Dumping and Countervailing Measures**. In this context, it is noted that recently there has been an increase in Trade Remedial measures by Brazil against Indian exports.

Subject: Regarding Inputs Sought on Anti-Dumping Investigations by Brazil Against Indian Products.

We wish to inform you about the recent developments concerning the growing number of **trade remedy actions** initiated by Brazil—specifically **Anti-Dumping (AD)** and **Countervailing Duty (CVD)** measures targeting Indian exports.

1. As of July 2025, six active trade remedy measures are in force against Indian products including polyester, PET films/resins, bicycle tires, and grinding media. Additionally, three new AD investigations have been initiated, covering hot-rolled stainless steel and agricultural tyres. A detailed list of current and terminated measures is attached.
2. According to Brazil's Department of Trade Defence (DECOM), trade remedy petitions rose by 165.9% in 2025 (117 compared to 44 last year), indicating a shift towards stronger protection of domestic industry. This trend aligns with previous policies under President Lula. Currently, 43 investigations are underway, with 24 targeting China.
3. During the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's visit to Brazil in July 2025, both sides reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening trade ties and addressing non-tariff barriers
4. India and Brazil operate a Trade Monitoring Mechanism (TMM), under which six meetings have been held since 2008. The 7th TMM is proposed for 7 October 2025 to discuss pending trade issues.

In this regard, members are requested to provide inputs for the following:

- Details of the impact of the imposed duties on your exports to Brazil.
- Potential implications of the ongoing anti-dumping investigations on your future exports.
- Likely implications of ongoing investigations on future trade

Your inputs will enable a coordinated response during the upcoming 7th India–Brazil TMM meeting.
